## **ROTARY 2022 INTERNATIONAL CONVENTION TO BE HELD IN HOUSTON**

*The event will bring more than 20,000 participants from around the world and deliver \$30 million in local economic impact*

HOUSTON (July 22, 2021) – During a joint news conference held at George R. Brown Convention Center today, Rotary and Houston First Corporation representatives announced that more than 20,000 service-minded people from around the world will gather in Houston for Rotary’s 113th annual international convention on June 4-8, 2022.

The coveted international event is returning to Houston for the third time, marking the 50th anniversary of the 1972 international convention. The Bayou City also hosted the 5th Rotary convention in 1914. The event is expected to deliver \$30 million in economic impact for the city’s hotels, restaurants, retailers and attractions.

“As a global membership organization that brings people from all continents and cultures together to share, learn and take action to bring positive and lasting change to communities around the world, we are thrilled that our first in-person international convention since 2019 will take place in Houston,” said Rotary’s International President Shekhar Mehta. “And for the first time ever, our annual event will be open to members of the public who want to connect, learn and be a part of our work to grow and change lives.”

Rotary’s 2022 international convention will transform the George R. Brown Convention Center into an energized hub and cultural

## **PROFESSIONAL EXPERIENCE**

In August 2011, Rod established the Law Firm of Moreno and Associates, which specializes in criminal, civil, and administrative litigation, including property disputes, breaches of contract, damages, intra-corporate struggles, quasi-delicts, family and personal relations matters, and high-profile cases such as the 2013 Balintang channel shooting incident, and non-bailable cases, such as the so called v-150 armored personnel carrier case, wherein numerous former top officials of the Philippine national police were detained for years without bail pending their trial in the sandiganbayan, and other cases such as Murder, Kidnapping, Syndicated Estafa, Homicide, qualified theft, Adultery, Libel, violations of Republic Act 3019 and other laws against graft and corruption, as private prosecutor as well as defense counsel, as well as labor and employment matters

Since the relatively short period of time following its establishment, Moreno and Associates has expanded its client base, such that Rod and his legal and non-legal staff handle cases in different trial and appellate courts throughout the Philippines, including the Supreme Court, as well as the Office of the Ombudsman and Sandiganbayan, and various prosecutor's offices and quasi-judicial bodies.

Moreno and Associates likewise represents clients in labor and employment disputes (where it has established a no loss record), as well as real property tax disputes, contract drafting and review, and provides basic legal support and advisory services.

The Firm's clientele spans the range of business and industry in the Philippines, from trading and importation companies to construction and customs brokerage firms, well known restaurant chains, real estate development corporations and security agencies, construction and manufacturing companies, garments production and distribution concerns, as well as financing and investment companies and prominent families and notable individuals.

The Firm is likewise at the forefront of advocacy in favor of licensed firearms owners, and spearheaded the filing of various Petitions in the Supreme Court against the Executive Department and the Philippine National Police led by then General Alan Purisima for the annulment of certain portions of Republic Act 10591 the new law governing firearms as well the imposition of fees for firearms licenses, which Petitions the Supreme Court granted in 2020.

The Firm is likewise immersed in lawyering for members of the security services from acting as defense counsel of the members of the Philippine Coast Guard charged with homicide for the shooting of a Taiwanese fisherman in the so called Balintang Channel incident, to assisting the Armed Forces in various legal struggles against secessionist groups.

Rod is currently a consultant of senator Richard Gordon and the senate electoral tribunal, as well as the senate blue ribbon committee.

## **CIVIC WORK**

Rod is the Vice-President and General Counsel of Gun Owners in Action ("Go Act"), a non-stock, non-profit organization which rod c0-founded that advocates on the judicial and legislative front, and via the mass media as well as social media, for the right of qualified civilians to own and possess firearms, as such rod is often a resource person in the upper and lower house of congress during hearings on contemplated legislation pertaining to firearms,

Rod is also a member of the Rotary Club of Pasig where he is a Paul Harris Fellow.

## **EDUCATION**

Rod earned his Juris Doctor Degree from the Ateneo De Manila University School of Law in 2005, and successfully hurdled the Bar Examinations during the same year. He is a Lifetime Member of the Integrated Bar of the Philippines Pasay-Paranaque-Las Pinas-Muntinlupa ("IBP-PPLM") Chapter. He earned his Bachelor of Arts Degree, Major in History, from the De La Salle University in 2001. As a student in DLSU, Rod was

While in law school, Rod was a member of the Board of Editors of the Ateneo Law Journal, and was also the Lead Editor for the Third Issue of Volume 48 of the said publication. As such, he has written three (3) articles for *The Journal*, and has gained extensive experience in legal research. Furthermore, his law school thesis on private international law continues to be required reading for students at the Ateneo.

## PERSONAL LIFE

Rod's passions include reading, particularly historical publications, practical and defensive shooting, in which Rod has earned various trophies and awards, boxing, Kali (Filipino Martial Arts), and Krav Maga.

## ADVOCACIES
