He started his path in social development work as a Jesuit Volunteer in the early 90's assigned to Philippine Partnership for the Development of Human Resources in Rural Areas Mindanao organizing and helping out farmers during the implementation of the Comprehensive Agrarian Reform Law. He underwent formation as a Jesuit seminarian in preparation for priesthood but he eventually left in 2000 to continue a life of service as a lay person. He believes in "doing good while doing well" and tries to live out a faith based life of service. He also currently serves as chairman of the Philippine Coalition on Volunteerism or PhilCV which strives to mainstream volunteerism for nation building and The Center for Art, New Ventures & Sustainable Development (CANVAS), a nonprofit organization, that works with the creative community to promote children's literacy, explore national identity, and deepen public appreciation for Philippine art, culture and the environment.

DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS IN BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS

As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:

- 1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;
- 2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country, and to the moral standards of my community;
- 3. Do all in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;
- 4. Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;
- 5. Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
- 6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
- 7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or professions;
- 8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

ROTARY CODE OF CONDUCT

As a Rotarian, I will

- 1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behaviors and activities
- 2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve in Rotary
- 3. Conduct all of my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others
- 4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings
- 5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society
- 6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community
- 7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring dis-favor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians
- Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship

- Stroke is the 2nd -3rd leading cause of death worldwide
- Hypertension is the # 1 contributing factor
- 10.8 Million die each year because of High BP
- 6 Million die each year because of Stroke
- 3.5 Million die last year because of Covid19

What is the benefit of controlling blood pressure?

A 10 mmHg ↓ in SBP leads to:

CHD Death	- 12 %
Stroke	- 27%
Heart Failure	- 25 %
Major CV Events	- 13%
All cause mortality	- 11%
