100% Paul Harris Society Club

For clubs in which every dues-paying member contributes a minimum of \$1,000 to the Annual Fund, PolioPlus, or global grants within a Rotary year

100% Foundation Giving Club

For clubs that achieve an average of \$100 in per capita giving and 100 percent participation, with every dues-paying member contributing at least \$25 to any or all of the following during the Rotary year: Annual Fund, PolioPlus Fund, approved global grants, or Endowment Fund.

100% Rotary's Promise Club

A designation provided to clubs in which every dues-paying member supports The Rotary Foundation's Endowment with a minimum commitment of \$1,000 or more in an estate plan or via an outright gift of \$1,000 or more. A certificate honoring the achievement will be provided upon request.

Every Rotarian, Every Year Club

For clubs that achieve a minimum Annual Fund contribution of \$100 per capita during the Rotary year, and every dues-paying member must personally contribute at least \$25 to the Annual Fund during the year.

Top Three Per Capita in Annual Fund Giving

For the three clubs in each district that give the most, per capita, to the Annual Fund. Clubs that give at least \$50 per capita are eligible.

Naming opportunities

Special opportunities are available to create an endowment or make a directed gift in your name or the name of a loved one. Endowed gifts are invested in perpetuity, with part of their earnings spent on a designated program. Directed gifts are spent in their entirety, usually in the following Rotary year.

Endowed global grant fund

- \$500,000 or more: You can specify up to three of the following: the district sponsor, the area of focus, the general geographic region of the project, or the type of grant activity, such as a project or scholarship.
- \$250,000 or more: You may choose up to two of the options listed above
- \$150,000 or more: You may choose one grant activity type, such as a humanitarian project, scholarship, or vocational training team.

Named endowment

If you donate \$25,000 or more, you can direct the money to one of the following:

- Area of Focus: funds global grants in one area of focus
- World Fund: funds global grants in all areas of focus
- SHARE: supports the World Fund and provides district designated funds to your district
- Rotary Peace Centers: supports Rotary's partnership with leading universities around the world to train professionals in conflict resolution, peace studies, international relations, and related disciplines

Directed gift global grants

- \$150,000: A one-time gift that provides funding for global grants in up to two areas of focus of your choice or to a special initiative of the Foundation, such as WASH in Schools
- \$30,000: A one-time gift that provides your district with funds for one or more global grants in an area of focus of your choice
- \$15,000: A one-time gift that provides funding for a global grant in an area of focus of your choice without specifying the district that will sponsor the grant

Rotary Peace Centers endowment opportunities

- \$1.5 million: Endows a Rotary Peace fellow every year
- \$1 million: Endows a Rotary Peace fellow every two years
- \$1 million: Endows a visiting lecturer every year
- \$750,000: Endows a Rotary Peace fellow every three years
- \$500,000: Endows a Rotary Peace fellow every four years
- \$250,000: Endows one Rotary Peace certificate fellow every year
- \$100,000: Endows an annual seminar at a Rotary Peace Center
- \$25,000 and up: Provides general support

Rotary Peace Centers directed gifts

- \$75,000: Provides funding for a Rotary Peace Fellow to complete a two-year master's degree program
- \$75,000: Provides funding for up to 10 internships or research projects for peace fellows
- \$60,000: Provides funding for five fellows enrolled in the three-month professional development certificate program
- \$10,000: Provides general support

Rotary Peace Symposium directed gifts

- \$400,000-\$500,000: Underwrites the cost of the Peace Symposium
- \$50,000-\$100,000: Provides full funding for a donor-specified element of the peace symposium (speakers, Rotary Peace Fellow travel, etc.)
- \$10,000-\$25,000: Provides funding for a hosted reception connected to the Peace Symposium
- \$10,000 and up: Provides general support for the Peace Symposium

Entrepreneurial named gift for peace

\$75,000-\$1 million: Funds new opportunities within Rotary's peace programs for global grants and the Rotary Peace Centers, such as workshops and retreats, and other initiatives.

RTN. ALEXANDER “Alex” L. LACSON

Alex Lacson is a bestselling author of patriotic books, a lawyer, businessman, and civil society leader.

Though a lawyer by profession, Alex’s first passion is writing books for the country.

In 2000, at the height of Asian crisis that crippled many countries, Alex seriously thought of migrating his family to the U.S. or Canada because our Philippines appeared hopeless at that time as it only got worse year after year. But after seriously thinking about it, he and his wife decided to stay and live their lives here, in the land where God planted them.

Alex wanted to see a developed and prosperous country for his children and the Filipino people. After deciding to stay and live in the Philippines, he was hit by a burning desire to help the country. He asked himself – “What can I do to help our country?” Upon reflection, he realized that he had always been a writer. Perhaps this was the small talent God gave him to help.

Thus, in 2005, he wrote the national bestselling book entitled “***12 Little Things Every Filipino Can Do To Help Our Country***”. To his pleasant surprise, it became an instant national bestseller. Since then Alex has written several more books that promote love for our country and good citizenship. One of these is “***12 Wonderful***

Things about the Filipino & our Motherland”, published in 2012. In this book, Alex speaks of what is good and beautiful about ourselves, the Filipino, and our country. He wrote this book so the Filipinos, especially the youth, would grow up believing that we are a great and beautiful people. Alex wants our youth to have a deep sense of faith in the Filipino and love for our country.

In 2008, he wrote the poem ***“I am Filipino”***, to help develop among our youth a healthy, positive, developmental, unifying and solution-seeking identity for the Filipino, beginning with our youth today.

In 2009, he wrote a poem entitled ***“Our Dream Philippines”***, founded on the aspirations and longings of the Filipino people. This poem has been adopted by a number of non-governmental organizations in the country.

In August 2020, Alex published ***“Five Hundred Years Without Love”*** – a political novel that exposes our country’s present-day social cancer in a comprehensive and wholistic manner, 133 years after Dr Jose Rizal wrote his famous ***Noli Me Tangere*** in 1887. In the last chapter of that book, Alex offers a set of radical reforms and programs that he believes could help us build our Dream Philippines.

In the past 16 years, through his many books and speeches, Alex has been building hope in the hearts and minds of the Filipino people in many parts of the country, by offering ideas on how we as people can be part of the solution to our country’s many problems even through small acts of love or patriotism.

Alex is a Builder of GOOD GOVERNANCE

Alex has been involved in the good governance work for many years. He is the former President & CEO of **ISA (*Institute of Solidarity Asia*)**, a public governance institute that implements and runs good governance & development programs in various LGUs and NGAs (national government agencies) like the Civil Service Commission, Department of Trade and Industry, Board of Investments, Philippine Heart Center, Armed Forces of the Philippines, Philippine Army, among others.

He is also the former Chairman of Civil Service Commission's Multi-Advisory Council.

Alex currently serves in the Board of Trustees of Alay Buhay Community Development Inc. and the ISA (Institute for Solidarity Asia). He also presently serves as a member of the Advisory Board of the Philippine Army. He previously served as a member of the Board of Directors of World Vision Philippines, Dilaab Movement, and Joey Velasco Foundation.

Alex is a Builder of DREAMS

For over 20 years now, Alex has been supporting many poor students as scholars, helping them in achieving their dreams for themselves and their families. He also helps in creating livelihood programs in some poor communities.

Alex was also the former president of PMTL (***Pilipino Movement for Transformational Leadership***), a coalition of faith-based organizations from the catholic, evangelical and protestant communities whose primary objective is to help in electing genuine servant leaders for national and local positions through the GabayKristo voter's program.

During the 2019 Elections, Alex served as the lead convenor of ***People's Choice Movement*** which gathered lay leaders from various faith-based organizations from the catholic, evangelical and protestant communities in the country. And using a standard criteria, they selected what they believed were the "10 Best Senatorial Candidates that our country and people need today".

Alex is a co-founder and partner of the ***MALCOLM Law Firm*** in Ortigas, Pasig City.

Alex was also a former legal consultant of the United Nations Development Program (UNDP) in the Philippines for several years. He was also a former columnist of the BusinessWorld Newspaper for seven years.

Alex is a graduate of the College of Law, University of the Philippines (Diliman), Batch 1996. In 2002, he took a short summer program at Harvard Law School in Harvard University, Massachusetts, USA. In 2007, he finished a leadership course and training based on Christian principles at the Haggai Institute in Singapore.

Alex is married to a beautiful wife, and has four wonderful children.

WORD ORIGINS

1. **Ampere.** This international term for a unit of electrical current derives from the name of Andre-Marie Ampere (1775-1836), the French physicist and mathematician.

2. **Atlas.** In Greek mythology, *Atlas* was a Titan who as a punishment for rebelling against the gods was forced to carry the heavens on his shoulders. Hence when the term was first used in English it was applied to a ‘supporter.’

3. **August.** The month of *August* was named by the Romans after their emperor Augustus (63 BC – 14 AD).

4. **Cardigan.** The *cardigan* was named after James Thomas Brudenell, 7th earl of Cardigan (1797 – 1868). An early sporter of button- through woolen jackets.

5. **Chauvinism.** *Chauvinism* in its original sense of ‘blind patriotism’ was coined in French from the name Nicholas Chauvin, veteran soldier of Napoleon’s campaigns.

6. **Dahlia.** The *dahlia* was named in 1791 in honor of Anders Dahl, an 18th century Swedish botanist who discovered the plant in Mexico in 1804.

7. **Fauna.** *Fauna* was a Roman goddess of the countryside, sister of *Faunus* (the Roman equivalent of the Greek Pan) who was a nature and fertility god worshipped by shepherds, farmers, etc.

8. **Nicotine.** *Nicotine* gets its ultimately from Jean Nicot, a 16th century French ambassador to Lisbon, who in 1560 got hold of some samples of the new ‘tobacco’ and sent them to the French Queen Catherine de Medici.

9. **Tantalize.** The verb *tantalize* was inspired by the sad story of Tantalus, a mythical king of Phrygia in the ancient world. He had displeased the gods in some way (version differ as to how, the commonest being that he had stolen their food). And as a punishment he was condemned to stand forever in water up to his chin while overhead hung boughs laden with fruit; whenever he stooped to drink, the water disappeared, and when he tried to reach the fruit, the wind blew it away. The term *tantalus*, coined in the 19th century can be seen but not got at, preserves the same idea.

10. **Thursday.** The Romans called the fourth day of the week *dies lovis* ‘Jupiter’s day.’ The Germans replaced this with *Thor*, the god of thunder.

11. **Volcano.** *Volcanoes* get their name from Vulcan, the Roman god of fire. His name in Latin was *volcanus*, and it was the Italian descendant of this, volcano, that was originally adapted as a term for ‘fire emitting mountain.’

5. Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or professions;
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

ROTARY CODE OF CONDUCT

As a Rotarian, I will

1. Exemplify the core value of integrity in all behaviors and activities
2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve in Rotary
3. Conduct all of my personal, business, and professional affairs ethically, encouraging and fostering high ethical standards as an example to others
4. Be fair in all dealings with others and treat them with the respect due to them as fellow human beings
5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring dis-favor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship

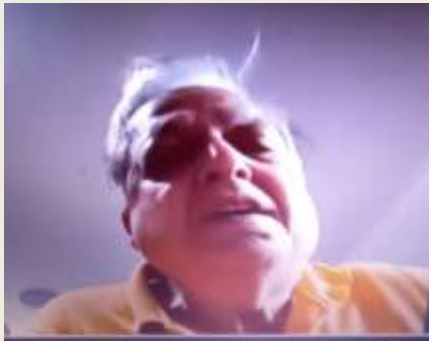

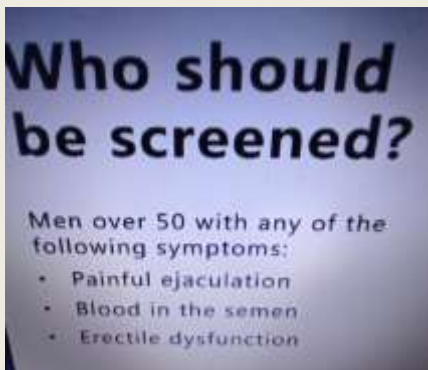
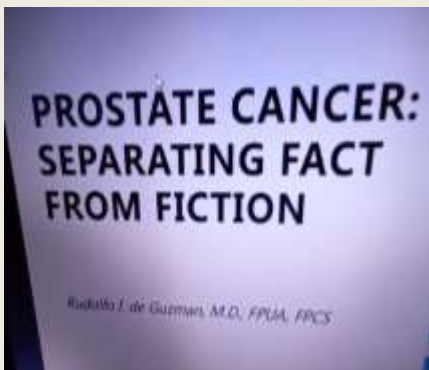
