**JOSE DALISAY JR., PhD**

JOSE DALISAY JR., PhD, has published over 40 books of fiction and nonfiction, and is Professor Emeritus of English at the University of the Philippines, from where he retired as Full Professor and Vice President for Public Affairs in 2019. He has won numerous awards for his writing, including the TOYM, the Palanca Hall of Fame, and the CCP Centennial Honors List, among others. His second novel, *Soledad's Sister*, was shortlisted for the inaugural Man Asian Literary Prize in Hong Kong in 2007 and has been published in French, Italian, and American editions. He was nominated for the National Artist Award in 2021. He writes a weekly Op-Ed column, "Qwertyman," and a monthly Lifestyle column, "Penman," for the Philippine Star.

He has been a Fulbright, Hawthornden, British Council, Rockefeller, David TK Wong, Civitella Ranieri, and Pacific Leadership fellow, and has lectured on Philippine culture and politics in the US, UK, Australia, Italy, China, Korea, Singapore, and Malaysia, among others. He is currently working on his third novel set in 1930s Manila while writing a history of Philippine accounting and editing a 12-volume history of UP Manila.

He collects vintage fountain pens, typewriters, antiquarian books, and watches, among others, and plays Texas Holdem poker for fun and profit.

## **The Story behind the Beatles song: " I M A G I N E "**



"Imagine" is a song by John Lennon from his 1971 album of the same name. The best-selling single of his solo career. It's the greatest number one single of all time, according to an Observer poll of the 100 best number ones. Lennon, beat Queen with 'Bohemian Rhapsody', the Beatles and Abba to top The Observer's poll of the best singles of the last 50 years.

The lyrics encourage listeners to imagine a world of peace, without materialism, without borders separating nations and without religion. Shortly before his death, Lennon said that much of the song's lyrics and content came from his wife, Yoko Ono, and in 2017 the process to give Yoko co-writing credit (while not yet confirmed).

Perhaps John and Yoko wrote this song to try and move people to think of that world, as a way to reach that world. They knew that there were dreamers out there like them who wanted peace, love, and equality. This song gave hope to those dreamers by addressing that maybe one day they would not have to “imagine” it.

The impact of this song is unquestionable. But disguised within its message of peace and love and its flowing piano melody is a collection of edgy, "dangerous" ideas that challenge society as we know it. The song that has become an anthem all over the world is actually full of controversial lyrics and radical ideas.
