- The first Asian RI President was Kiyoshi Togasaki of Tokyo, Japan who served in 1968-69.
- The Rotary Award for World Understanding and Peace was first preentnted in 1981.
- Neil Armstrong, the first man to walk on the Moon was a member of the Rotary Club of Wapakoneta, Ohio, USA.
- The Rotary clubs at Quito, Ecuador; Libreville, Gabon; Singapore and Kampala, Uganda all meet approximately on the equator.
- The first Rotary club project was a “comfort station” in downtown Chicago.
- The one millionth Rotarian was from Thionville, France.
- RI could have been named The FFF Club (Food-Fun-Fellowship)
- Rotary's emblem has remained unchanged since 1929
- The blue in the emblem stands for constancy in purpose and the gold for the pure standard upon which rotates the wheel of eternal progress.

Blind Spots

The story of the blind Bartimaeus in the Gospel According to Mark (Mk. 10:46-52) tells about how this blind man relentlessly called out to Jesus for healing. Though he did not know Him or see him perform previous miracles, Bartimaeus believed Him that He would listen to him. Probably he learned about Him through the stories he heard from his folks. Nonetheless, when he heard he was coming, he shouted to Him that He may heal him. As Jesus heard him, He healed Him right away. So, what can we learn from this?

Like Bartimaeus, we experience blindness in our lives though we have a 20/20 clear vision with our eyes. Often times, our blind spots are the people we hold dear in our lives yet failed to express or articulate our feelings to them. More than that, we fail to recognize God's Presence in our lives. What makes us so blind? It's probably our pride, our despair, our complacencies, or our conceitedness that we believe we ourselves are more than enough that we thought we no longer need others or God. But the truth is, we need God in our lives not just for miracles to happen in our lives full of problems but also His Loving Presence simply because we as His children cannot exist without Him by our side.

Let us then develop a habit of prayer, even spending 5 minutes of prayerful silence for God amidst our busy lives. In doing so, we'll be able to see what our eyes cannot see and that is God's loving Presence.
