





Dear Fellow Pasig Rotarians,

“Together, we see world where people unite and take action to create lasting change — across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.”

This is the vision of Rotary, and last night, we embodied it as we renewed our sisterhood with the Rotary Club of Hong Kong Sunrise.

Our sisterhood began in 1994, when then-Rotarian Tim Tam journeyed to the Philippines in search of a Rotary club worthy of partnership. Without any connections or leads, he found himself drawn to the Rotary Club of Pasig — and the bond was born. Over the years, Rtn. Tim Tam moved on to charter a new club, yet the relationship he helped establish has endured for three decades.

Admittedly, there have been periods of quiet between our clubs, but as history often repeats itself, Pasig Rotarians, led by PRID Raffy Garcia and PP Celso Ylagan, rekindled the bond during a trip to Hong Kong years ago. Last night, I felt deeply honored to be part of this significant event, as I stood alongside these two gentlemen to once again renew this sisterhood, marking the 30th year since its inception.

Tuesday, November 19 was also the gala dinner in Hongkong of *The One International Humanitarian Award*, an initiative of a Hong Kong Rotarian and friend of PRID Raffy. This year’s honoree Dr. Paul Thistle, a Canadian, has dedicated over 30 years to a rural mission hospital in Zimbabwe, serving 250,000

people with compassion and unwavering commitment. I had the privilege to ride with him to the airport last night. As I listened to Dr. Thistle's story, I couldn't help but admire the spirit of service that transcends borders.

In reflecting on these moments — Rtn. Tim Tam's journey to Pasig, Dr. Thistle's work in Zimbabwe, and PRID Raffy Garcia's unexpected rise from a self-confessed RINO (Rotarian in Name Only) to a leader in the Rotary world — I am reminded of the *flight of the bumblebee*. By all logic, the bumblebee should not be able to fly; its small wings and heavy body defy the laws of aerodynamics. Yet it flies, simply because no one told it otherwise.

International athletes speak out about polio

New Team End Polio campaign reminds people about a tenacious disease

Ramesh Ferris wants you to see his legs.

“When people see me walking with my crutches and braces, if I’m not wearing shorts, they do not think of polio,” says Ferris, who contracted the disease at six months old. “But when people see my legs, they’re like, ‘Oh, what happened?’ It starts a discussion around what people can do to work together for a polio-free world.”

Ferris tries to wear shorts whenever he’s hiking or using his hand-cycle, a three-wheeled device powered by hand cranks. And he’s found other ways to channel his athleticism into the fight against polio. In 2008, he hand-cycled 7,140 kilometers (4,437 miles) across Canada to raise awareness and funds for polio eradication.

Using a 27-speed hand-cycle and consuming 5,000 calories a day to maintain his energy, Ferris traveled 400 kilometers (249 miles) every 10 days from British Columbia in the west to Newfoundland in the east. His Cycle to Walk trip raised funds for Rotary International’s End Polio Now effort and other anti-polio projects.

Now Ferris has joined Team End Polio, a new campaign by the Global Polio Eradication Initiative to raise awareness about the

need to wipe out the disease. Team End Polio's starting roster of top international athletes includes several who, like Ferris, have been directly affected by the disease. All are determined to speak up on social media and at sporting events.

"Polio is one of these forgotten-about diseases that is 'out of sight and out of mind,'" says Ferris, a member of the Rotary Club of Whitehorse-Rendezvous, Yukon, Canada.

The effort to fully eliminate polio has been a massive project. It's reduced cases by 99.9% over four decades, and today the wild poliovirus endures in just a few places around the world. And yet, as is true in many races, the final lap is the hardest part.

"It is critical that people realize that polio knows no borders," says wheelchair athlete Minda Dentler, who contracted polio as an infant. "As long as this disease exists anywhere, it is a threat to children everywhere."

Dentler used a hand-cycle to complete the New York City marathon in 2006 and later qualified for the Ironman World Championships. It took her two tries, but she became the first woman wheelchair athlete to complete the grueling triathlon. She had to swim 2.4 miles, hand-cycle 112 miles, and propel her racing wheelchair for 26.2 miles, with a time limit for each stage. The second time she competed, she crossed the finish line in 14 hours and 39 minutes.

"I learned how, with perseverance, anyone can overcome obstacles and achieve goals that seem impossible," says

Dentler, who published a children's book in March titled, "The Girl Who Figured It Out." She says that same quality is needed for the fight against polio.

"With continued effort from donors and affected countries, we can overcome the remaining challenges and deliver a polio-free world," she says. "But increased funding and continued commitment to vaccinating every child is essential."

Like Dentler, the other athletes on Team End Polio embody ideals associated with sportsmanship: strength, dedication, determination, and the ability to work as part of a team.

When you compete in a sport like football, you have to rely on your teammates to defeat your opponent. The fight against polio is no different," says Michael Essien, a coach and former star player from Ghana. During a trip to Liberia in June 2024, he says, he witnessed the collaboration and coordination required to implement a polio vaccination campaign.

"To end polio, it will require all of us working together as one team," he says.

During his term as president, the Rotary Club of Kalookan North was able to implement 64 projects and activities in the City of Caloocan. Some of the most notable projects during his term were the citywide Jobs Fair Cum Livelihood which generated more than 1,000 jobs

(local and international) for the people of Caloocan. He was able to sponsor 103 scholars for college and various vocational and technical scholarships. He was also able to implement several first-time projects for his club. Because of the significant contributions of his club in Caloocan City, the Rotary Club of Kalookan North was awarded as the Most Outstanding NGO in Caloocan City. This award was presented by then VP Gloria Macapagal-Arroyo and Mayor Rey Malonzo during the foundation day of Caloocan City.

His love for service to other people and his leadership skills can be traced back to his elementary, high school to college days where he consistently became a student leader and held several positions in his various school organizations including the San Beda Student Council and the San Beda Marketing Association where he served as president and was awarded as the Most Outstanding Professional Organization in the whole San Beda College during his college years. With this contribution to his school, San Beda College awarded Bobby the Philippine Association for Collegiate School for Business Award for Excellence in Academics and Leadership during their graduation ceremonies. He is also a recipient of the Outstanding Alumnus Award from San Beda College in July 2007.

Currently, he is the Executive Vice President of PCCI Caloocan Chapter. He became an active Board Member and Assistant Treasurer of Red Cross Caloocan City Chapter. He became the Secretary General of the Council of Community Elders of PNP Caloocan City. He became the overall chairman of NAMFREL Caloocan Chapter for two national elections and local elections.

He is also a 3rd Degree Knight of Columbus and became a Deputy Grand Knight of San Gabriel Parish in Morning Breeze Caloocan City.

He also served as the National and Founding Chairman of the Chemical and Pharmaceutical Industry Organization of the Philippines, Inc. – a partnership and industry arm of the Philippine Drug Enforcement Agency where he received several awards and commendations from PDEA. He also served as Vice President for External Affairs of SPIK or Chemical Industry Association of the Philippines.

Having been in Rotary for 33 years now, Bobby has served and held various district positions almost every Rotary year. He became an Assistant Governor for three (3) terms, Senior Assistant Governor, Lieutenant Governor for two (2) terms, became a member and chairman of several committees, projects, and activities in District 3800.

He is a recipient of the Four Avenues of Service Citation for Individual Rotarians, awarded by RI President Carlo Ravizza during RY 1999-2000. SOME HISTORICAL INSIGHTS...

- Ten of 56 Club Presidents are authentic Pasigueños. The rest either worked, resided or were married to Pasigueñans.
- Valle Verde Country Club is the 7th venue of the club meetings and it moved there in 1985.
- Of the 29 charter members, only 2 retain as active members.
- 24 Past Presidents are still active members while 23 have already passed away.
- The club has 4 second generation and one 3rd generation Rotarians of its 93 current members.
- The club organized 5 other clubs in Pasig with 4 still active clubs as the Rotary Club of Pasig Midtown was short-lived.
- It has an Interact Club at Rizal High School organized in 1987.
- A Rotaract Club at Pamantasan ng Lusod ng Pasig was organized in 2016.
- In RY 1987 – 1988, it formed the Rotary Village Corps of Ilugin and Sampaguita in Bgy. Pinagbuhatan.
- It formed a Pasig Club Trust Fund in 1979 which became the Rotary Club of Pasig Foundation Inc. in 2008.







Who would probably not in their right minds be not worry if he or she reads this:

“But in those days, after that suffering, the sun will be darkened, and the moon will not give its light, and the stars will be falling from heaven, and the powers in the heavens will be shaken. “Then they will see ‘the Son of Man coming in clouds’ with great power and glory.
