With World Polio Day on 24 October, I'm proudly rooting for Rotary as we team up around the world to End Polio Now.

I had the honor of attending a Strike Out Polio event in July at PNC Park, home of the Pittsburgh Pirates MLB team. The Rotary Club of Delmont-Salem hosted the event, which raised \$1.3 million for PolioPlus.

Later in the summer, I joined members of our Rotary family in supporting the Más Millas Menos Polio (More Miles Less Polio) bike ride. Felipe Meza Chávez and his team rode all the way from Ciudad Juárez, Mexico, to One Rotary Center in Evanston, Illinois, to raise money and awareness. The ride took 12 days, and Felipe and his team collected more than \$100,000 to support the fight against polio. It was a joy to greet them as they arrived in Evanston.

SOME ASTOUNDING FACTS ABOUT BEER

Zythology - The study of beer and beer making, including the role of particular ingredients play in the brewing process.

The oldest written recipes ever discovered by human beings for making beer - written on clay tablet over 5,000 years ago in the form of songs.

Oldest beer ad on a clay tablet - 4000 BG adorned with a large-breasted woman holding two goblets and is inscribed with the caption "Drink Ebla Beer - the beer with the heart of a lion!"

The first professional brewers were all women.

Hops used in beer are in the same family of flowering plants as marijuana. 2000 BC - the first recorded driving incident in ancient Egypt - an inebriated charioteer is apprehended after running down a vestal virgin of the goddess Hathor, The culprit is crucified on the door of the tavern that sold him the beer, and his corpse allowed to hang there until scavengers reduced it to bones.

Beer gone bad - When British brewers tried to send their pale ales over to India, the beer would go bad during the long ocean voyage. Beer makers began to add extra alcohol and hops to help with the preservation. This inadvertently created a new style of extra bitter, extra powerful beers called India Pales Pale Ales (IPAS).

There are 400 types of beer. Belgium has the most individual beer brands in the world.

Cenosillicaphobia is the fear of an empty beer glass.

Most expensive beer at \$1,000 per bottle: Vielle Bon Secours.. This beer is so expensive that it is only sold in one bar, Bierdrome, in London.

The agricultural revolution was started because people needed a way to make more beer. This led to inventions such as the plow, wheel and irrigation systems.

Beer made with spit: Ancient Indian girls age 8-10 would chew corn into a pulp like consistency in their mouths, then spit the pulp out into huge vats of warm water to sit for several weeks. The viscous, cloudy, lumpy spit filled mixture would later be strained.

The oldest claimed functional brewery in the world: Bayerische Staatsbrauerei Weihenstephan near Munich, founded more than nine centuries ago in the year 1040.

Beer for health - Beer contains almost all of the minerals we need to survive. It was a staple of many diets during the European Middle Ages, when good nutrition was rare. You drank beer to survive. Drinking wasn't just for adults. Children also consumed beer as a source of energy and nutrients.

Beer makes you smarter. A study in the New England Journal of Medicine found that women who drank moderately had better cognitive function compared to non-drinkers. Researchers pointed out the alcohol raises HDL cholesterol (that's good cholesterol) which is associated with a lower risk of heart disease and better cognitive functioning.

Beer prevents kidney stones A study published in American Journal of Epidemiology found that "beer consumption was inversely associated with risk of kidney stones (in middle aged men). Each bottle of beer consumed per day was estimated to reduce risk by 40%,

The Question Presented

What are the islands in the West Philippine Sea that are part of Philippine territory under Philippine sovereignty?

The Greatest Misconception In Philippine History

Some Filipino public intellectuals, including legal luminaries, have repeatedly stated that Philippine territory is *limited to the islands within the lines of the 1898 Treaty of Paris* between Spain and the United States. This is factually, legally and historically false. This has misled our people, and the rest of the world, as to the true extent of Philippine territory. Worse, it has emboldened China to claim the Spratlys and Scarborough Shoal.

Philippine Sea Arbitration Case

Glimpses of Last Meeting

The 1898 Treaty of Paris Lines as Popularly Known



This misconception coming from highly regarded Filipinos has gravely misled the world, Filipinos and foreigners alike, as to the true extent of Philippine territory. *It is imperative to correct once and for all this dangerous misconception.*

The National Territory under the 1935 Constitution

Article 1, Section 1 of 1935 Constitution

"The Philippines comprises all the territory ceded to the United States by the Treaty of Paris concluded between the United States and Spain on the tenth day of December, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, the limits of which are set forth in Article III of said treaty, *together with all the islands embraced in the treaty concluded at Washington*, between the United States and Spain on the seventh day of November, nineteen hundred, and in the *treaty concluded between the United States and Great Britain* on the second day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty, and all territory over which the present Government of the Philippine Islands exercises jurisdiction."

Three Treaties Define Philippine Territory

The 1898 Treaty of Paris ceded to the United States the "archipelago known as the Philippine Islands" and "*lying within the following line*" of the Treaty of Paris. The 1900 Treaty of Washington clarified that the cession included "*any and all islands belonging to the Philippine Archipelago, lying outside the lines*" of the 1898 Treaty of Paris. The 1930 Treaty between the United States and the United Kingdom demarcating the boundary between North Borneo and Southern Philippines defines the "Philippine archipelago" as "the territory acquired by the United States of America by virtue of the treaties of December 10, 1898, and November 7, 1900, with Her Majesty the Queen Regent of Spain."

Importance of Three International Treaties

The three International Treaties defining Philippine territory are binding on all states that have accepted, consented or failed to object to the three treaties.

These International Treaties give rise to the international law principle of *Uti Possidetis Juris* governing the boundaries of former colonies that became independent during the decolonization process. Under the *Uti Possidetis Juris* principle, these boundaries must be respected by all states.

Philippine territory and

Uti Possidetis Juris Applies to the Spratlys

"The essence of this principle lies in its primary aim of *securing respect for the territorial boundaries at the moment when independence is achieved*. xxx This is true both of the States which took shape in the regions of South America which were dependent on the Spanish Crown, and of the States Parties to the present case, which took shape within the vast territories of French West Africa. *Uti possidetis*, as a principle which upgraded former administrative delimitations, established during the colonial period, to international frontiers, is therefore a principle of a general kind which is logically connected with this form of decolonization wherever it occurs" (Burkina Faso v Mali, ICJ, December 22, 1986)

The three treaties establishing Philippine territory were entered into by the Colonial Powers (Spain, US and UK) and should be respected, under the *Uti Possidetis Juris* principle, as the territory of the Philippines when it achieved independence on July 4, 1946.

The Islands of the Philippine Archipelago

To know the extent of Philippine territory that must be respected by all states under the *Uti Possidetis Juris* principle, we have to know the islands constituting the Philippine Archipelago since the international treaties refer to Philippine territory as the "archipelago known as the Philippine Islands" or the "Philippine Archipelago."

So, what are the islands of the Philippine Archipelago constituting Philippine territory covered by the Uti Possidetis Juris principle.

1947 China Handbook

China's Ministry of Information revised the China Handbook in 1947. Chapter 1 of the revised Handbook defined the territory of China as follows:

"The territory of the Republic of China begins in the north from latitude 53° 52' 30" N. (Sajan Mountains) and in the east from longitude 135° 2' 30" E. (the confluence of the Amur and the Ussuri Rivers). The southernmost and westernmost boundaries remain to be settled as the Pamirs on the west constitute an undemarcated area among China, the U.S.S.R. and the British Empire, and the sovereignty of the Tuansha Islands (the Coral Islands) on the south are contested among China, the Commonwealth of the Philippines and Indo-China. The northern section of the boundary between China and Burma remains to be demarcated."

China's claims and need

China's Admission Before the Arbitral Tribunal

China did not participate in the arbitration but China officially submitted to the Arbitral Tribunal a Position Paper which stated:

"Prior to the 1970s, Philippine law had set clear limits for the territory of the Philippines, which did not involve any of China's maritime features in the South China Sea. Article 1 of the 1935 Constitution of the Republic of the Philippines, entitled 'The National Territory', provided that 'The Philippines comprises all the territory ceded to the United States by the Treaty of Paris concluded between the United States and Spain on the tenth day of December, eighteen hundred and ninety-eight, the limits which are set forth in Article III of said treaty, together with all the islands embraced in the treaty concluded at Washington between the United States and Spain on the seventh day of November, nineteen hundred, and the treaty concluded between the United States and Great Britain on the second day of January, nineteen hundred and thirty, and all territory over which the present Government of the Philippine Islands exercises jurisdiction."

China is Bound by the 1900 Treaty of Washington

By officially submitting its Position Paper to the Arbitral Tribunal, China expressly, formally and judicially recognized and admitted that Philippine territory is defined by three treaties, including the 1900 Treaty of Washington. With this clear and categorical admission, China can no longer claim, as it continues to claim up to now, that Philippine territory is limited only to the islands enclosed by the Treaty of Paris lines. By its judicial admission, China is forever estopped from claiming that Philippine territory is limited to the islands enclosed by the Treaty of Paris lines.

CONCLUSION

The Philippine national territory consists of (1) all the islands of the Philippine Archipelago lying within the lines of the 1898 Treaty of Paris; (2) all the islands of the Philippine Archipelago lying outside the lines of the 1898 Treaty of Paris as clarified in the 1900 Treaty of Washington, and as shown in the 1734 Murillo Velarde map, the 1808 Carta General del Archipelago Filipino, and the 1875 Carta General del Archipelago Filipino, and (3) all the islands on the Philippine side of the boundary demarcated in the 1930 US-UK Treaty separating British North Borneo and Southern Philippines.

RECOMMENDATION

The Philippines should invite China, Vietnam and Malaysia to submit the territorial dispute in the Spratlys to voluntary arbitration by the International Court of Justice. Separately, the Philippines should also invite China to submit the territorial dispute over Scarborough Shoal to voluntary arbitration by the International Court of Justice. This will finally settle by peaceful means, as mandated by the UN Charter, the territorial disputes in the Spratlys and Scarborough Shoal.

If these other disputant states are not willing to submit the territorial dispute to arbitration by the International Court of Justice, the Philippines can present its iron-clad evidence of sovereignty over the Spratlys and Scarborough Shoal to the court of world opinion. The whole world will then know that the Spratlys and Scarborough Shoal truly belong to the Philippines.

Wheat not Weeds

Body Mutilations

Mark 9:42-46 seems to paint Jesus as a merciless Judge that He demands that our hands, feet, and eyes should be severed from our bodies whenever we sin. But did Jesus really mean that? Or was it His way of teaching us something important?

If we are going to read it and understand literally what Jesus meant, then surely we have a very merciless and even ruthless God who is more than willing to punish us, sinners, rather than forgive us whenever we repent. But, according to biblical scholars, Jesus in any Gospel accounts used a number of figures of speech and images to drive out His message to His audience. In this biblical passage, He used hyperbolé. With that, we can understand what he wanted to teach us.

If your hand causes you to sin, cut it off. He means avoid sinning like stealing, hurting, bullying, and lying.

If your foot causes you to sin, cut it off. He means avoid going to places or being involved with bad people that will cause you to do bad things.

If your eye causes you to sin, pluck it out. He means avoid glancing and reading obscene, malicious, and even unholy materials that can tarnish our souls.
