Our Guest Speaker



Prof. Nestor T. Castro, PhD

Dr. Nestor Castro is Professor of Anthropology at the University of the Philippines Diliman. Specializing in Cultural Anthropology, his expertise includes ethnicity and indigenous peoples' issues, environmental and social impact assessment, museology, and cultural heritage management. His works have been published in notable journals such as *Le Temps Modernes*, *New Asian Visions*, *Colloquium: The New Horizon of Contemporary Sociological Theory*, *Philippine Social Sciences Review*, *Kasarinlan*, and *Diliman Review*.

Dr. Castro did field research in several indigenous communities in the Philippines, Indonesia, Malaysia, Myanmar, New Caledonia, Papua New Guinea, Solomon Islands, Thailand, and Vietnam. His Master's thesis was on the communist movement in the Cordillera region of northern Philippines while his PhD dissertation was on the politics of ethnic identity among the Kalinga indigenous people of the Cordillera region.

Dr. Castro served as Chair of the Anthropology Department, Associate Dean of the College of Social Sciences and Philosophy (CSSP), and Vice Chancellor for Community Affairs of UP Diliman. He also served as the Vice Chairman of the Anthropological Association of the Philippines (UGAT), Vice Chairman of the National Research Council of the

Philippines (NRCP) – Social Sciences Division, and Southeast Asian Representative of the International Commission for the Rights of Aboriginal People (ICRA), President of the International Federation of Social Science Organizations (IFSSO), and President of the International Council of Museums – Philippines (ICOM-PH). At present, Dr. Castro is Vice President of the Pi Gamma Mu International Honor Society in the Social Sciences – Philippine Alpha Chapter, Vice President of Tahanan ng Pagmamahal Children's Home, Inc., and Regent of the Pamantasan ng Lungsod ng Pasig (PLP). He also sits as a member of the Pasig City Council for Culture and the Arts (PCCCA).

Among the awards received by Dr. Castro are the Education Leadership Award 2019 given by the World Education Congress; the Exemplary Alumni Award 2020 given by the Pasig Catholic College; the Award for Education, Culture, and Heritage 2022 given by the Tambuli ng Mamamayan ng Pasig; the Lifetime Achievement Award given by the International Federation of Social Science Organizations in 2024; and the Gawad Parangal para sa Natatanging Pasigueño 2024 by the Local Government of Pasig City.

Aside from teaching and research, Dr. Castro regularly appears on Philippine television as resource person on Philippine culture.

GREAT THINGS YOU CAN DO WITH BEER (BESIDES DRINKING IT!)

Beer has a number of other useful purposes and best of all, most of them can be done using leftovers and dregs from the bottom of the bottles and cans, so you don't have to sacrifice your precious drinking nectar!

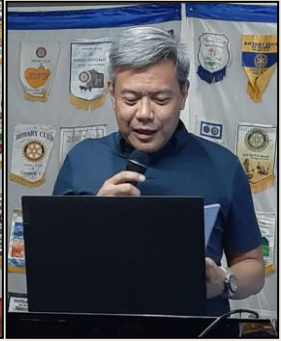

6. Loosen Rusty Bolts - Apply it, leave it for a few minutes to allow the carbonation to break down the rust.
7. Spice Your Rice - Add something extra to your long grain jasmine or basmati rice by cooking it in a dark beer. The rice absorbs the beer and produces a lovely flavor.
8. Soak Your Feet - Using beer mixed with some white vinegar can really refresh your feet. The many antioxidants and nutrients are great for you skin.

Eye of the Needle

It is easier for a camel to go through the eye of a needle than for a rich person to enter the kingdom of God (Mark 10:25).

Jesus, in this Gospel passage, used a metaphor to teach us a lesson. It's His way of saying that we must give up all our material and financial attachments that hinder us from loving Him totally. He also meant that we must give up our selfish pride and vices. In this way, we become more open to His Grace and Presence in our lives. Moreover, we become more open to be with other people, both the people we care and people who deserves our care like the poor families in a depressed area.

By the way, the “eye of the needle” is a kind of gate in Jerusalem that only camels are allowed to enter. But, in order to enter it since it was small and narrow, camel owners have to unload all stuffs from their camels. Once they entered, that's the only time owners can mount back their stuffs on their camels. This is the reason behind this metaphor Jesus used.

Perhaps, a fitting question for all of us in relation to this: what are the things that we must give up in order to be open for God and others?
