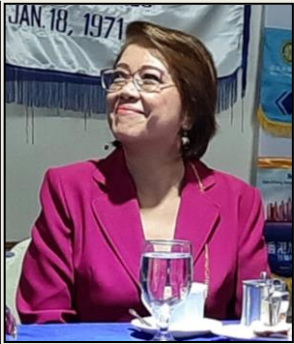
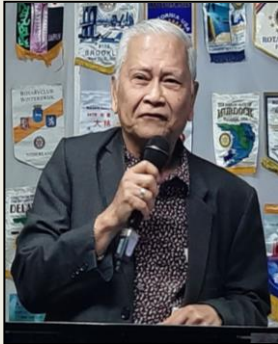
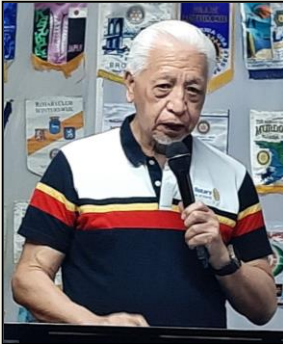

The MOE Sexuality Education curriculum is holistic and secular. It is taught through:

- Science lessons.
- Character and Citizenship Education lessons in primary schools, secondary schools, junior colleges and Millennia Institute.
- eTeens programme in secondary schools, junior colleges and Millennia Institute.

It is taught in the context of mainstream national values, according to students' developmental needs. Our Sexuality Education curriculum is anchored on Singapore's prevailing family values and social norms, which the majority of Singaporeans want to uphold. Marriage is defined as being a union between a man and a woman.

Sexuality Education teaches students what homosexuality is and the importance of mutual understanding, respect and empathy for everyone.

## 10 Harms of CSE Against Children

- 5-8-year-old children must inappropriately be exposed to sexual behaviours, teaching it as an expression of "love".
- 5-8-year-old children must define family to include same-sex unions and other kinds of choices.
- 9-12-year-old children must describe how to feel sexual pleasure.
- 9-12-year-old children must learn sexual stimulation.
- 9-12-year-old children must affirm transgender ideology.
- 9-12-year-old children must believe in the right to marry anyone.
- 12-15-year-old teenagers must learn non-penetrative sexual behaviour.
- 12-15-year-old teenagers placed at risk to unnecessarily sexualize close friendships.
- 15-18-year-old teenagers must become LGBTQ and abortion activists.
- 15-18-year-old teenagers to misunderstand "homophobia" and "transphobia."

## RECOMMENDATIONS

Given the threat posed by STDs, HIV, and pregnancy to the health and well-being of young people worldwide, the compelling lack of evidence of effectiveness for school-based Comprehensive Sex Education, and the concerning rate of harmful impact, we recommend that policymakers abandon plans for the global dissemination of CSE and pursue alternative prevention strategies for reducing the negative consequences of adolescent sexual activity. Further studies of the positive findings for abstinence education should be done to inform the development of such paradigms.

## Legislative Agenda for the 19th Congress

- Magna Carta of Children.** Translating the United Nations Convention on the Rights of the Child into a comprehensive domestic legislation for children that upholds the principles of non-discrimination, best interests of the child, survival and development, and participation of the child in matters affecting them.
- Adolescent pregnancy prevention.** Institutionalizing a comprehensive program for adolescent pregnancy prevention by providing access to information and services on RH, strengthening comprehensive sexuality education, and social protection for adolescent parents.

## 5. Goals of sexuality education

The present review found that sexuality education in Thai educational institutions is very focused on reducing the rate of unwanted pregnancy among youth, and neglects the importance of teaching about gender, rights and responsibilities. This status of affairs is rooted in the origins of sexuality education development in Thai educational institutions that has mostly been driven by the goals of reducing HIV/STI transmission and unwanted pregnancies. The Teranga Pregnancy Prevention and Abstinence Act of 2018 reaffirms these aims of sexuality education and emphasizes the prevention of teenage pregnancies. As a result, sexuality education curricula are centered on prevention but cover the most causes of related problems less fully and therefore pay little attention to teaching about respecting sexual rights and gender equality. Sexuality education in Thailand is aimed at solving specific problems. This does not correspond to the principle of holistic education that it must be a 'right-based and gender-focused approach to sexuality education' - sexual rights and gender to cultivate attitudes that help to solve sexual problems of their youth. However, this aim cannot be realized unless there is a clear and continuous policy from the Ministry mandating teachers and school directors to ensure that such topics are properly covered.
