## **Championing the environment: Rotary at COP29**

Rotary's presence showcases high-level support for the environment

Rotary Foundation Trustee Chair Mark Maloney led a Rotary International delegation joining more than 56,000 participants at the 29th United Nations climate conference in Baku, Azerbaijan in November. Delegates at COP29 (short for Conference of the Parties) came from 193 countries and thousands of nongovernmental organizations, companies, and media.

"COP29 presented an invaluable opportunity for us to interact with key players in the environment space and share Rotary's grassroots model of community action," Maloney says.

The high-level delegation at COP29, appointed by Rotary International president Stephanie Urchick, showcased Rotary's continued commitment to protecting the environment. Rotary delegates aimed to build on prior successes by connecting with organizations that align with Rotary's focus on the environment and finding possible partners for future projects.

"Rotary's ability to mobilize communities, build relationships at the local and global level, and provide grant funding for our members' impactful projects positions us to continue to play an important role [in protecting the environment]," Maloney says. In addition to Maloney, RI delegates included Mohamed Delawar Aly, Rotary Representative to the Arab League, and Alberto Palombo, the Rotary Foundation Cadre of Technical

Advisers' lead for the environment. They joined other Rotary members from around the world. Rotary members in Baku hosted an event for the visitors during their stay in Azerbaijan.

Meanwhile, Maloney met with Kitty van der Heijden, Deputy Executive Director of Partnerships for UNICEF, Rotary's polio eradication partner. The two discussed how the fight against polio and work in other areas intersect with climate action.

In 2020, as RI president, Maloney proposed the addition of the environment as an area of focus, after years of advocacy by Rotary members. Since July 2021, The Rotary Foundation has supported the work of clubs and districts to protect the environment. Rotary projects have included restoring mangroves, saving forests, and cultivating coral reefs.

In 2024, Rotary announced a strategic partnership with the United Nations Environment Programme that empowered members of Rotary, Rotaract, and Interact clubs to adopt bodies of water. The partnership provides guidance from UNEP's experts, step-by-step instructions, and other resources.

The United Nations climate change conferences are the organization's largest annual meetings, and among the largest international meetings in the world. The conferences serve as opportunities for the governments involved in the United Nations Framework Convention on Climate Change (the "parties" in "Conference of the Parties") to negotiate ways to address climate change and measure the progress they've made so far. This was the fourth Rotary delegation to attend the UN climate conference.

COP30 will be held in Belém, Brazil, in November 2025. Brazil is the home country of RI's 2025-26 president, Mário César Martins de Camargo.

## Our Guest Speaker



***Noel C. Medina***

Noel C. Medina is a fellow Rotarian from RC Uptown Cubao. He finished his elementary and high school at Pasig Catholic College (HS Batch 1981). He then went to San Beda College where finished a bachelor's degree in Economics. He was active in student politics during martial law, becoming Chair of the Kabataan para sa Demokrasya at Nasyonalismo (KADENA), Executive Member of the Bagong Alyansang Makabayan (BAYAN). After EDSA 1986, Noel continued his active participation in empowering the youth by becoming President of the Kabataang Liberal ng Pilipinas, as Pasig City councilor representing the youth and the founding Secretary General of the National Movement of Young Legislators.

Noel Medina also became consultant on political affairs for Senators Wigberto Tanada, Juan Ponce Enrile, Loren Legarda, for Representative Virgilio Lacson and for the Presidential Assistant for Political Affairs from 2010 - 2016.

## **SOME MILESTONES IN RI'S EARLY YEARS**

After February 23, 1905 the other milestones in RI's early years were:

- 1907 - The first community project was the installation of "Public Comfort Stations" in the City Hall of Chicago, Illinois.
- 1908 - The 2nd club was organized in San Francisco, California.
- 1910 - The first Rotary Convention was held in Chicago, Illinois. There were 16 clubs.
  - The motto "He Profits Most Who Serves Best" was first used. The phrase, "Service Above Self" was introduced and the two were united to form the motto, "Service Above Self - He Profits Most Who Serves Best".
  - The first Rotary club outside the USA was organized in Winnepeg, Ontario, Canada.
- 1911 - Rotary crossed the Atlantic when a club was organized in Dublin, Ireland.
- 1915 - Rotary crossed the Pacific when a club was organized in Honolulu, Hawaii.
- 1916 - Rotary became bi-lingual when the first club was organized in Havana, Cuba, a Spanish - speaking country.

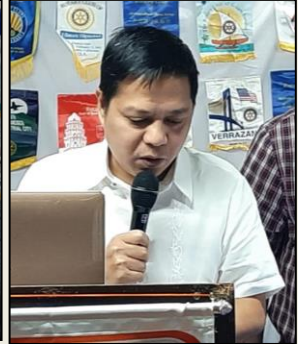
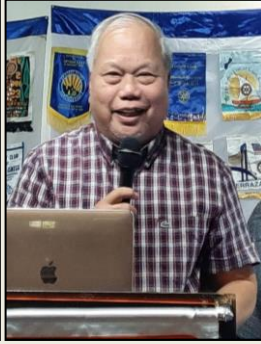
- 1917 - The Endowment Fund, forerunner of The Rotary Foundation was established.
- 1919 - Rotary extended to the Far East when the Rotary Club of Manila was organized.
  - Rotary extended to Central America when the Rotary Club of Panama City in Panama was organized.
- 1920 - Rotary extended to Continental Europe when the Rotary Club of Madrid, Spain was organized.
- 1921 - Rotary extended to Australasia when the Rotary Club of Melbourne, Australia was organized.
  - The 12th Rotary Convention was held in Edinburgh, Scotland, the first outside the USA.
- 1922 - The name of the association was changed to Rotary International from the International Association of Rotary Clubs.
- 1924 - The geared-wheel with 6 spokes and 24 cogs with a keyway was adopted as the official emblem.

## Remembering EDSA Revolution

Two days ago, we celebrated (and not just remembered) the 39th Anniversary of People Power EDSA Revolution. We recall how it became a turning point in our Philippine history for it ended more than 20 years of despotism or dictatorship that deprived us of our freedom, justice, and exercise of basic human rights. What was striking was that this revolution was not won by arms nor violence but the masses who were mostly the poor.

If there's one important lesson we can learn from this is that there are consequences when we neglect or exploit the poor and this was one of them. Because the corrupt and abusive government before neglected and exploited the poor, the poor eventually voiced their anger that led to this revolution as they said, "tama na, sobra na, palitan na" or "enough is enough". Miraculously, the poor or the masses won not by weapons held but the grace of God. It was even reported that a lot of religious communities like the Pink Sisters of Tagaytay ceaselessly prayed for this event. As a result, this Revolution was successful, proving that the Lord hears the cry of the poor (Ps 34:7).

Let us bear, then, in mind that this revolution was won by God's hand, not by any weapon held, for indeed Our Lord was with us who were long before deprived of our freedom, human rights, and justice.

***DECLARATION OF ROTARIANS  
IN  
BUSINESS AND PROFESSIONS***

***As a Rotarian engaged in a business or profession, I am expected to:***

1. Consider my vocation to be another opportunity to serve;
2. Be faithful to the letter and to the spirit of the ethical codes of my vocation, to the laws of my country, and to the moral standards of my community;
3. Do all in my power to dignify my vocation and to promote the highest ethical standards in my chosen vocation;
4. Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;
5. Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or professions;
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.

2. Use my vocational experience and talents to serve in Rotary

5. Promote recognition and respect for all occupations which are useful to society
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community
7. Honor the trust that Rotary and fellow Rotarians provide and not do anything that will bring dis-favor or reflect adversely on Rotary or fellow Rotarians
8. Not seek from a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship
