Jimmy Carter's vision for peace

This story appeared in the February 2018 issue of Rotary magazine.

It's a crisp, sunny day in late October, and school groups are touring the Jimmy Carter Presidential Library in Atlanta.

They see the Bible that the 39th U.S. president took his oath on, a campaign ledger, and a mockup of the Oval Office – as well as his diploma in square dancing, a “Peanuts to President” game board, and a Marvel comic with the Carter family joining Captain America in saving energy.

At the end of the exhibit is Carter's Nobel Peace Prize, which he received in 2002 in recognition of his decades of work advancing peace and human rights.

“This is the biggest award in the world,” one of the field trip leaders explains to the elementary school students. Then she puts it into terms they will understand: “This is bigger than the Super Bowl MVP, believe it or not.”

Perhaps she should have mentioned his two Grammys.

Carter has spent his life fighting for peace: brokering the 1978 peace talks between Egypt and Israel that led to the Camp David Accords, paving the way for a nuclear pact between the United States and North Korea in 1994, and monitoring elections in Panama, Nicaragua, Venezuela, and other places where the ballot box became an alternative to civil war. During

his time in office, from 1977 to 1981, the United States was not involved in any wars.

For the past 37 years, Carter has been redefining what it means to be a retired president – and the country’s longest-lived one at that, having surpassed Herbert Hoover (who lived 31 years after leaving the White House). During his presidency, Carter made a commitment to human rights the cornerstone of his foreign policy; he and his wife, Rosalynn, continued that emphasis when they founded the Carter Center in 1982. The center’s programs revolve around two main themes: peace and health.

“We feel that there’s a human right of people to live in peace,” he told *The Rotarian*. “We feel it’s a human right to have a modicum of health care, to have a decent place in which to live, to have a chance to have an education, to have freedom of speech and freedom of religion and the right to elect your own leaders.”

The center has observed 105 elections, including recent contests in Liberia, Kenya, the Philippines, Zambia, and Guyana, and it has worked with the United Nations and other groups to develop standards for democratic elections. When democratic avenues fail, the center mediates armed conflicts. It is currently involved in efforts to resolve the Israeli-Palestinian conflict, as well as conflicts in Sudan and South Sudan, Syria, and Liberia; it’s also working to combat the rise in violent religious extremism and Islamophobia in Europe, the Middle East, and the United States.

On other fronts, the Carter Center has formed a task force on

disease eradication. The only one of its kind in the world, it analyzes data to ascertain which diseases could be eradicated from the entire world. The center is focusing on eradicating Guinea worm disease and regionally eliminating five other diseases: river blindness, trachoma, schistosomiasis, lymphatic filariasis, and malaria.

“I might say if Rotary wasn’t leading that fight to eradicate polio now, the Carter Center would – it’s the kind of thing that would be very exciting for us,” Carter says. “We’re very proud to see the progress that Rotary has had with that.”

Carter knows the power of service organizations well – he’s a member of the Lions club in his hometown of Plains, Georgia, and a past district governor. And for more than 30 years the Carters have dedicated a week each year to volunteering with Habitat for Humanity.

Carter spoke with senior staff writer Diana Schoberg by phone from his home in Plains on Halloween. Still very involved in the community where his family has lived since 1833, he planned to go downtown that night to join other local leaders in greeting trick-or-treaters.

DG Guinigundo served the BSP for 41 years, handling monetary policy, treasury operations, loans and credit, asset management, currency management, regional operations and international operations. He was Alternate Executive Director at the International Monetary Fund in Washington, DC in 2001-2003. Earlier, he was Head of Research at The SEACEN (Southeast Asian Central Banks) Research and Training Centre in Kuala Lumpur in 1992-1994.

He was at the forefront of regional financial integration for over 20 years. He served as the first head of the technical group for the Chiang Mai Initiative in 2000-2001. He chaired the ASEAN +3 meetings of finance and central bank deputies at various points including the ASEAN Senior Level Committee twice. DG Guinigundo also chaired the EMEAP Monetary and Financial Stability Committee of central bank deputies in Asia and the Pacific.

As BSP deputy governor, he chaired the BSP's Monetary Policy Strategy Committee which implements the central bank's monetary operations. He was vice-chairman of the BSP's Investment Management Committee and the central bank's

Provident Fund. He also represented the central bank in cabinet-level NEDA Board, National Food Authority, Development Budget Coordination Committee, Economic Cluster, National Home Mortgage Corporation and Trade and Related Matters.

DG Guinigundo graduated AB class valedictorian, cum laude, at the University of the Philippines School of Economics. He earned his M.Sc. in Economics at the London School of Economics as a scholar of the then Central Bank of the Philippines. He holds an honorary Doctor of Divinity (DD) degree from the Promise Christian University in Los Angeles, California. He taught economics at the University of the Philippines Manila and St. Scholastica's College .

He writes weekly columns for the Manila Bulletin and BusinessWorld. He is a member of the Advisory Panel of the Sim Kee Boon Institute for Financial Economics of Singapore Management University. He is also a member of the Board of Advisors of the International Care Ministries, a non-governmental organization supporting the poor and other marginalized sectors in the Philippines. An external advisor to Bain & Company with headquarters in Boston, Massachusetts, USA, he is also an independent director of the AIA Philippines Investment Management and Trust Corporation (AIA IMTC Phil) and the conglomerate MacroAsia Corporation.

He is one of the convenors of 1Sambayan. He is also a fellow of the Foundation for Economic Freedom and a member of the Management Association of the Philippines.

He chaired the Advisory Panel of the ASEAN + 3

Macroeconomic Research Office based in Singapore for 2023-2024. Since October 2023, he has been the principal advisor of New York-based GlobalSource Partners for the Philippines.

In 2021-2022, Mr Guinigundo co-edited *Trauma to Triumph: Rising from the Ashes of the Asian Financial Crisis* published by the ASEAN+3 Macroeconomic Research Office. He also co-edited *Redefining Strategic Routes to Financial Resilience in ASEAN +3* under the auspices of the Asian Development Bank. He contributed an article "Philippines: Pursuing an Investment-Led, More Sustainable Economic Growth" in *Beyond the Crisis: A Strategic Agenda for the Next President of Stratbase ADRI* (Albert del Rosario Institute for Strategic and International Studies). In early 2023, he also wrote a book *Economic Adjustment and Growth: Theory and Practice* with Dr Delano S Villanueva and Dr Roberto S Mariano published by World Scientific.

He is the senior pastor of the Fullness of Christ International Ministries based in Mandaluyong and vision keeper of *Touching Heaven Changing Earth*, a national movement for nation transformation established in 2005.
