Prof. Gwen Grecia-De Vera is currently an Associate Professor at the University of the Philippines College of Law, handling courses in Political Law and Commercial Law (JD Program) and Comparative Competition Law (LLM Program). She is the Program Director of the Competition Law and Policy Program (CLPP) of the University of the Philippines Law Center. She previously served as Director of the UPLC Institute of International Legal Studies from 2008 to 2011, Director of the Institute for the Administration of Justice in 2023, and Assistant to the Dean on Student Affairs from 2019 to 2023. She was Bar Examiner in Political Law for the combined Bar Examinations of 2020 and 2021.

She has experience in advisory, transactional and litigation work in both the private and public sectors, as partner at Puyat Jacinto & Santos (PJS Law) where she led teams in Infrastructure, Regulatory and Compliance, as well as Arbitration. She previously served as the Dean of the Manuel L. Quezon University School of Law.

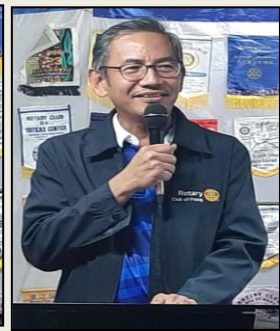
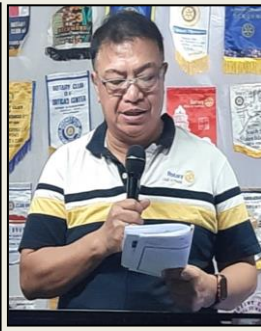

4. Be fair to my employer, employees, associates, competitors, customers, the public and all those with whom I have a business or professional relationship;
5. Recognize the honor and respect due to all occupations which are useful to society;
6. Offer my vocational talents: to provide opportunities for young people, to work for the relief of the special needs of others, and to improve the quality of life in my community;
7. Adhere to honesty in my advertising and in all representations to the public concerning my business or professions;
8. Neither seek from nor grant to a fellow Rotarian a privilege or advantage not normally accorded others in a business or professional relationship.
